"She had always been an earnest and intelligent student of the Bible, and to her it grew more wonderful every day. She believed that the spread of the Book was the simplest and most natural and direct way of preaching the Gospel and keeping it pure...

...Her own reading of it was mainly accomplished in the early morning. As soon as there was light enough—which was usually about 5:30—she took a fine pen and her Bible and turned to the book she was studying in the Old or New Testament...

...She underlined the governing words and sentences as she went along in her endeavour to grasp the meaning of the writer and the course of his argument; word by word, sentence by sentence, she patiently followed his thought...

...Sometimes it would be three days before she completed a chapter, but she would not leave it until she had some kind of idea as to its purpose...
