1. Perspectives

A. Eternal

11. Problems

A. Lack of faith

*But without faith it is impossible to please him: **for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him.** Hebrews 11:6*

C. Husband/wife relationship

*Likewise, ye husbands, dwell with them according to knowledge, giving honour unto the wife, as unto the weaker vessel, and as being heirs together of the grace of life; **that your prayers be not hindered.***

D. Unlawful requests

Ye ask, and receive not, because ye ask amiss, that ye may consume it upon your lusts. James 4:3

E. Adversary/spiritual warfare

Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour. I Peter 5:8

For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places . . .

III. PROVISIONS

A. The Spirit of God / Our Interpreter

B. The Word of God / Our Authority

So shall my word be that goeth forth out of my mouth: it shall not return unto me void, but it shall accomplish that which I please, and it shall prosper in the thing whereto I sent it. Isaiah 55:11

C. Christ Himself / Our Mediator

“Simon, Simon, behold, Satan has demanded permission to sift you like wheat; ³² but I have prayed for you, that your faith may not fail; and you, when once you have turned again, strengthen your brothers.” Luke 22:31

IV. Practical Applications

Prayers for Our Children

1. Salvation to every generation till time shall be no more.
(Romans 10:1; Psalm 78:6-7)

“. . . we desire humbly to plead it with thee. They are thine; save them; enable them, as they become capable, to make it their own act and deed to join themselves unto the Lord, that they may be owned as thine in that day when thou makest up thy jewels.”

- *2. Pray that our children will fear the Lord and serve Him.
(Deuteronomy 6:13)
- *3. Pray that our children will hate sin. (Psalm 97:10; 119:104)
***Through thy precepts I get understanding;
therefore I hate every false way.* (Psalm 119:104)
- *4. Pray that our children will be caught when they are guilty. (Psalm 119:71)
- *5. Pray that our children will respect those in authority over them. (Romans 13:1)
- *6. Pray that our children will desire the right kind of friends and be protected from the wrong kind.
(Proverbs 1:10, 15)
- *7. Pray that our children will be kept from the wrong mate and saved for the right one. (II Corinthians 6:14)
- *8. Pray that our children and their prospective mates will be kept pure until marriage; I add – and after marriage remain faithful until death parts them. (I Corinthians 6:18-20)

- *9. Pray that our children will learn to submit totally to God and actively resist Satan in all circumstances. (James 4:7)
- *10. Pray that our children will be single-hearted, willing to be sold out to Jesus – a “good soldier”. (Romans 12:1-2; II Timothy 2:3-4)
- *11. Pray that our children will be hedged in so they cannot find their way to wrong people or wrong places, and that wrong people cannot find their way to our children. (Hosea 2:6-7)
- *12. Pray that our children will have quick, repentant hearts. (Psalm 51:1-3)
- *13. Pray that our children will honor their parents, so all will go well with them. (Ephesians 6:1-2)
- *14. Pray that our children will be teachable and able to take correction. (Isaiah 54:13; Proverbs 13:1)
- *15. Pray that our children’s lives will bear the fruit of the Spirit. (Galatians 5:22-23)
- *16. Pray that our children will live by the Spirit and not gratify their flesh. (Galatians 5:16)
- *17. Pray that our children will trust in the Lord for direction in their lives, including their occupation. (Proverbs 3:5-6)
- 18. Pray that our children would learn obedience through the things that they suffer. (Hebrews 5:8)
- 19. Pray for a spirit of gratitude. (1 Thessalonians 5:18)
- 20. Pray that our children will delight in the holiness of the Lord’s Day. (Isaiah 58:13-14)

Prayers for us as Parents

1. Pray that as parents we might be filled with the knowledge of God's will in all wisdom and spiritual understanding. (Colossians 1:9b, James 1:5)
2. Pray that we train our children in faith and not fear; that we faint not. (II Timothy 1:7; Luke 18:1)

3. Pray that as parents we will train up our children in the way they should go so that when they are old they will not depart from it. (Proverbs 22:6)
4. Pray as parents we will have an awareness of when to say "no" to our children because of our own propensity to particular sins; in order that we do not aid in leading them into temptation, but help in delivering them from evil. (Numbers 14:18; Matthew 6:13)
5. Pray that as parents we will not provoke our children to anger so that they will not be discouraged. (Colossians 3:21)
6. Pray that we as parents would remember that a soft answer turns away wrath, and that grievous words stir up anger. (Proverbs 15:1)
7. Pray the prayer of Solomon. (I Kings 3:9)
8. Pray that Lord would teach us as parents those things that we see not; and when we have sinned, to repent. (Job 34:32)

9. Pray that as parents we will have discernment in living a simple life, so that our children's minds be not corrupted from the simplicity that is in Christ. (II Corinthians 11:3)
10. Pray that we would take heed and keep our souls diligently lest we forget the things which our eyes have seen, and lest they depart from our heart all the days of our life: and to teach them to our sons, and our sons' sons. (Deuteronomy 4:9)
11. Pray that as parents we will be quick to hear, slow to speak and slow to wrath. (James 1:19-20)
12. Pray that as parents we would be channels of blessing, equipped to do the Lord's will. (II Timothy 2:21b)

Review of first Four Teachers on Prayer (April 08, 2015)

2. Tertullian – days of persecution – pray for the delay of the final end. Jesus Christ teaching on prayer is new wine stored in new bottles.
3. Augustine – In the darkness of this world Christians feel themselves desolate and continue in prayer.
~ Pray for a happy life.~
4. Martin Luther – gave us reasons to pray:
commanded to pray – not because we are lazy only – but because we are fearful to pray. Come as you are, PRAY. God doesn't hear us because of our holy prayer, but because we are in Christ.
