Kindness Expanded

In English, Hebrew, and Greek, kindness synonyms are overlapping and not clearly or consistently distinguishable in meaning. Goodness, mercy, pity, love, grace, compassion, gentleness, tenderness and many more encompass the many-sided meaning of kindness.

Kindness Defined

Kindness as spiritual fruit links the spiritual qualities of kindness and goodness and has been described as a "sincere desire for the happiness of others. Goodness is the activity calculated to advance that happiness. Kindness is the inner disposition, created by the Holy Spirit, that causes us to be sensitive to the needs of others . . . Goodness is kindness in action – words and deeds."

- Proverbs 10:19 When there are many words, transgression is unavoidable, but he who restrains his lips is wise.
- Proverbs 15:1 A gentle answer turns away wrath: but a harsh word stirs up anger.
- Proverbs 17:27 He who restrains his words has knowledge, and he who has a cool spirit is a man of understanding.
- Proverbs 17:28 Even a fool, when he keeps silent, is considered wise; when he closes his lips, he is considered prudent.
- Proverbs 18:2 A fool does not delight in understanding, but only in revealing his own mind.
