What can we do and where do we start?


Obviously this training does NOT begin when your child turns 16, 18, or even 21, but it begins even before they are born. However, since we are talking about preparing our adult children for marriage we will continue teaching these things as we have when they were younger!

1. Ask God for help and strength every day.
Prayer is our number 1 resource. You can teach your child the Word, but you cannot make him a Christian; you can lead him to knowledge, but you cannot make him think. All of our efforts are vain unless they are blessed by God. (Psalm 127:1)
2. Teach them God's design for marriage, the home, and the family.
 - Marriage is a life-long commitment to God and to each other. (Matthew 19:6)
 - Husband submits to God
 - Wife submits to husband
 - Children submit to parents. (Ephesians 5:22 – 6:1)
3. Show them how to walk with God themselves.
 - Read the Word daily.
 - Study it.
 - Apply it to life.
4. Teach them purity.
 - Exemplify modesty in the home.
 - Teach them to keep themselves pure for their future mate.

5. Pray consistently for their future spouse.

These prayers would be the same as those for your own children.

- To come to know Christ at an early age
- To develop a deep love for God
- To develop Christ-like character
- To keep themselves pure
- That God would protect them
- etc.

²³ Her husband is known in the gates, when he sits among the elders of the land. ²⁴ She makes linen garments and sells them, and supplies belts to the tradesmen. ²⁵ Strength and dignity are her clothing, and she smiles at the future. ²⁶ She opens her mouth in wisdom, and the teaching of kindness is on her tongue. ²⁷ She looks well to the ways of her household, and does not eat the bread of idleness. ²⁸ Her children rise up and bless her; Her husband also, and he praises her, saying: ²⁹ "Many daughters have done nobly, but you excel them all."

³⁰ Charm is deceitful and beauty is vain, but a woman who fears the LORD, she shall be praised. ³¹ Give her the product of her hands, and let her works praise her in the gates.
